Please read general rules in front of book – note the change in rule #3.

1. **Fresh Flowers** to be focal point in all displays and arrangements.
2. **All flowers to be grown by the exhibitor.**
3. All exhibits to be in place between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. on **Tuesday, September 8th**.
4. All Exhibits to be removed at 5:30 p.m. Sunday, September 13th.
5. Flowers and plants must be **insect and disease free** to be eligible for judging.
6. All classes are open to men and women.
7. Renfrew Agricultural Society cannot be responsible for containers of value if lost or broken.

Hints For Exhibitors

1. Cut flowers are to be shown on their own stem with their own foliage.
2. Cut flowers should be as uniform in size as possible and if more than one bloom is requested try to use the same colour if possible.
3. Make sure to **measure the diameter** of the blooms and enter the proper size in the proper section.
4. A Stem is a plant structure carrying one or more flowers and/or buds.
5. A Bloom is an individual flower, one to a stem.
6. If a bud is showing colour it is considered a bloom.
7. Exhibits must contain the exact number of flowers specified in the section.
8. Remove wilted petals and remove any debris from the pot.
9. In the dahlia classes the blooms should be approximately 45 degree angle from stem.
10. The ideal gladiola spike should be one-third open blooms, one-third bud and one-third green, shown in a container that keeps the stem upright. If necessary pebbles etc. may be used in the container to keep the stem in an upright position.
11. African violets should contain only a single crown per pot.
12. In floral arrangements, the large flowers and strong colours are the best placed at the base of the exhibit and the arrangement shall be viewed from all sides unless otherwise specified.
13. The oasis or mechanics of an arrangement should not be visible.
14. All candles within an arrangement require the wick to be burned.
15. A bouquet or a Tussy Mussy is a handheld arrangement. Therefore the arrangement should be properly bound and in water.

16. Make sure you note the size of the container or the measurements specified for each entry. When doing arrangements a miniature design is not to exceed 5” in any dimension including the container base and accessories, small designs are 5.5” to 10” and must not exceed 10” in any dimension including the container base and accessories.

4. "A Tisket , A Tasket" – an arrangement in a basket with a handle.
5. "Let Us Give Thanks" – a **Thanksgiving** arrangement using flowers, foliage and berries.
6. "Golden Years" – an arrangement featuring golden flowers and a candle(s).
7. "Cream of the Crop" – a dainty arrangement in your favourite cream server, suitable for a ladies afternoon tea.
8. "Pretty Practical" – an arrangement using a recycled article as a container. **Note: The container must be accompanied by a hanging device so that it may be hung on a wall.**
9. "Left Overs" – a collection of a minimum of **FIVE DIFFERENT** types of flowers in a kitchen utensil.
10. "Thinking Of You" – an arrangement suitable for shut-ins.
11. "Sole Thoughts" – an arrangement using flowers and ornamental grasses in an **appropriate container.**

13. Asters – red or purple, 3 blooms, double.
14. Asters – white, 3 blooms, double.
15. Asters – single, 3 blooms, any colour.
16. Snapdragons – single, 3 spikes.
17. Dwarf Sunflower – 3 blooms, any colour.
18. Dwarf Sunflower – "Teddy Bear Type", 3 blooms.

19. Calendula – Scotch Marigold, 5 stems.
20. Hosta, green or blue, 3 leaves.
21. Hosta, any other colour, 3 leaves.
22. Gloriosa Daisy – 3 blooms, with foliage.
23. Gallardia – 3 blooms, with foliage.
24. Dahlias – 3 blooms, less than 2” with foliage.
25. Dahlias – 3 blooms, 2” to 5” with foliage.
26. Dahlias – 1 bloom, 5” and larger with foliage
27. Marigolds – 3 stems, any colour less than 3” with own foliage – SINGLE BLOOM.
28. Marigolds – 3 stems, any colour less than 3” with own foliage –DOUBLE BLOOM.
29. Marigolds – 3 blooms, any colour 3” and over with own foliage.
30. Pansies – 3 stems, pure colour (all one colour).
31. Pansies – 3 stems, with faces, any colour.
32. Sweet Peas – any variety – 7 stems.
33. Phlox – Perennial – 1 stem, any colour.
34. Lavatera (Annual Mallow) – a display in a suitable vase.
35. Zinnias – 3 blooms, 2” and under, any colour or colours.
36. Zinnias – 3 blooms, 2” to 4”, any colour or colours.
37. Zinnias – 3 blooms, over 4”, any colour or colours.
38. Petunias – 3 stems, single, purple.
39. Petunias – 3 stems, single, any colour.
40. Petunias – 3 stems, double, any colour.
41. Petunias – 3 stems, single, bi-colour.
42. Cosmos – white, pink or crimson, display in a suitable vase.
43. Dwarf Cosmos – any colour – a display in a suitable container.
44. Salvia – Annual – 3 spikes, any colour.
45. Rose – 1 stem, more than one bloom, any colour.
46. Rose – 1 bloom, any colour.
47. Rose – Miniature, 2 stems, any colour.
48. Floating Fantasy – one perfect rose with foliage.
49. Shrub Rose – 1 stem, any colour, more than one bloom.
50. Sedum – 1 stem – Autumn Joy.
51. Sedum – 1 stem – variegated leaf.
52. Sedum – 1 stem – other than specified in 50 and 51.
53. Cleome – 3 spikes, any colour.

NOTE:

GLADIOLUS MUST BE IN A TALL STURDY GLASS CONTAINER.

54. Gladiolus – 1 spike, white or pink colour.
55. Gladiolus – 1 spike, any shade of yellow.
56. Gladiolus – 1 spike, any shade of orange.
57. Gladiolus – 1 spike, any shades or red or purple.

PLANTS ESTABLISHED

In sections 58 to 69 prize money will be:

59. Geranium – single – in bloom, 1 plant, any colour.

63. Potted Herb, identified, pot not to exceed 10”.
64. One houseplant – foliage plant – other than Ivy – **named.**

67. Succulent – one plant – **plant to be named.**
68. Impatiens – one plant – established and in bloom.
69. “MOST UNUSUAL PLANT” – pot not to exceed 15”. - **TO BE NAMED.**
